ABOUT CHEROKEE NATION PUBLIC SCHOOL APPRECIATION DAY



Cherokee Nation earmarks 38 cents of every dollar spent on a vehicle tag for public schools in northeast Oklahoma.



Since 2002, the Cherokee Nation has distributed more than \$62.3 million to more than 100 school districts.



Cherokee Nation motor vehicle school funds are unrestricted allowing school districts to meet needs within their school systems.



As state funding has decreased, Cherokee Nation's contributions to public schools through the motor vehicle tag sales have increased for eight consecutive years.



Cherokee Nation allocates funding based on number of students who are Cherokee Nation citizens. In fiscal year 2019, more than 100 school districts receiving funds had more than 31,000 Cherokee Nation citizens enrolled.
